## **Education in Region**

Our future study day is planned for 10th March 2024; we are currently awaiting venue confirmation.

As a committee we have decided to incorporate the AGM into the programme, as a majority of our members attend the study day. The aim is to generate some interest in the section and encourage active involvement.

## <u>Current Issues in Region</u>

#### Waitemata

The first phase of voluntary redundancy opportunity has been rolled out. This affects staff across the board; admin, physicians and nurses

To date 492 offers have been accepted with a finishing date over the next few months.

In total they received 892 expressions of interest, and 662 offers have been made.

Currently they are assessing whether a future round of voluntary redundancy might be offered.

**Tōtara Haumaru** is a new 150 – bed surgical facility that opened at North Shore Hospital in July. It has 8 theatres and has a capacity for 15,000 operations a year once fully staffed, this is projected to be mid-2025, at present 140 staff work in the new surgical building, 36 are new recruits.

One of our committee members recently attended a staff meeting, they were informed that Waitemata is not employing staff at present and there would be no changes to their hours of employment, so nurses wanting to increase or decrease hours have been put on hold and anyone who leaves will not be replaced.

#### **Counties Manukau**

Continues to employ newly graduated enrolled nurses.

Enrolled nurses continue to make a difference to patient care across the organisation with ENs in most areas

A former member of the EN section who has been working in clerical for some years has been made redundant, but I am not aware of any front facing nurse being offered redundancy

#### Feed back

Members are interested in receiving feedback following EN Section national meetings.

Our committee discussed the best way to do this would be to have a summary sent out to all the section chairpersons, outlining projects you are working on or updates that are relevant and who you meet with. We understand that some information will not be relevant to share but we feel there will be information that is appropriate, we can then forward onto our memberships. Midlands Section committee were happy to respond, and we look forward to any changes that maybe instigated within Health New Zealand Te Whatu Ora Waikato. Erin's also reports that there are four EN graduates in the ENSIPP programme for September, who will be working in Tokoroa, Te Kuiti, Theatre at Waikato and Springhill prison (not hired by Health NZ Te Whatu Ora Waikato) but will be in the ENSIPP programme. Recruiting is underway for February/March 2025.

It is encouraging to see the number of Enrolled Nurse positions advertised around the country in all areas of health. It is a great time be an Enrolled Nurse!

A large number of health workers attended the two-hour paid stop work meeting held 30<sup>th</sup> August. Key talking points were the holidays act remediation and non-hiring freeze. # **Education in Region:**

Enrolled Nurse students from Otago Polytechnic are in Dunedin hospital presently on clinical placements for 5 weeks. Apparently 5-6 have pulled out of New Zealand Diploma in Enrolled Nursing to do the Batchelor of Nursing in 2025. Commenced at start of 2024 with 36 students.

An Enrolled Nurse has been employed .6 FTE as a tutor in the New Zealand Diploma of Enrolled Nursing at Otago Polytechnic, which is absolutely great news. Has to complete some teaching papers.

Southland Institute of Technology Awards Ceremony is on the 3<sup>rd of</sup> December at the Civic Theatre. I am attending to present the two Enrolled Nurse Awards from National Enrolled Nurse Section and Southern Region Enrolled Nurse Section.

#### **Current Issues in Region**

Some Enrolled Nurse Graduates from this year, who didn't get on the ENSIPP are finding it hard to find Enrolled Nurse positions. Some indicating that they wished they hadn't done the EN programme, so supporting them and looking out for positions. But hard when no positions are available. As I write this, an Enrolled Nurse has messaged me to say she has got an EN position in Timaru, in an aged care facility. Had an interview today and offered position after the interview.

Dunedin Hospital ENSIPP has 9 on the programme, up 1 from previous report of 8. One new Enrolled Nurse graduate has been employed at Public Health, which is great. Worked there as an HCA, and they converted that position to EN. Discussed with her at September Graduation that she ensures they don't have her still working as an HCA.

# News:

We had to cancel our annual study day on the 5<sup>th of</sup> October due to the civil emergency in Dunedin and all main highways into Dunedin were closed.

Study day now confirmed for Saturday 22<sup>nd</sup> February 2025 at the Otago Museum. Jane Wilson, Chief Nursing and Midwifery Officer confirmed today she is available. Hopefully she is still in that position, as HNZ restructuring for one position covering South Canterbury and Southern.

I met with Jane, in September, regarding Enrolled Nurses and the new scope and what Enrolled Nurses would be able to in the future. Very supportive and I am looking forward to what EN's will be able to do in the future.
