#### Education in Region

We are pleased to announce that NorthTec (No longer Te Pukenga) have continued to provide the Diploma of Nursing in Northland. Student numbers are small, due to no funding options that were previously available. There currently is an initiative being looked into by the DON of NorthTec to see if she is able to provide a faster pathway for experienced EN's wanting to complete their Bachelors of Nursing. This initiative, will be in Northland only if it gets across the line.

## Current Issues in Region

There are no new current issues in Northland, apart from the ongoing issues of nurses who are newly graduated trying to find employment. These are both EN and RN new grads. The other issue seems that Te Whatu Ora have now road blocked funding for current nursing staff to progress on their pathways to NP. ## In Erin's own words:

- "Unfortunately we have only been able to hire one EN graduate for the Feb/Mar cohort." We have also just extended an offer to one more EN graduate who we will aim to start in March.
- "The Wintec EN2 cohort were welcomed to Waikato this week (4.2.25) at the student whakatau (Maori welcome ceremony) there are approximately 50 students which is the largest Wintec has seen."
- "We have put approximately 30 ENs through the IV Administration Update Workshop so they will able to be signed off in practice for the new IV changes."
- "We are working with the PDU to establish what the new scope will look like at Waikato but are waiting for some more guidance from Nursing Council – from this we have also started talks with Wintec to make sure we are all on the same page with the new scope going forward."

Midlands are in the process of trying to engage with Wintec to have an opportunity to speak with Diploma of Enrolled Nurse students about the Enrolled Nurse Section. It has been a few years since we spoke with Wintec students and from those visits we attracted only a few new members.

Currently, at Wintec Nursing Graduation we present all enrolled nurses with a small gift and information about the Section and at the Special Awards evening we present two enrolled nurse awards

## **Education in Region:**

Otago Polytechnic are hoping/planning for 30 enrolled nurse students this year. They will commence on 24<sup>th</sup> February 2025

Southland Institute of Technology - 14 x year 1 enrolled nurse students and 14 x year 2. Zero fees continue again this year at SIT.

#### Second year Enrolled Nurses Students

Half of the 30 EN students are due to go back on clinical placements commencing 3<sup>rd</sup> March 2025 They are currently in classes. The other half are already out on clinical placements and then will be back in class.

The EN programme head has got the Dunedin Hospital ENSIPP coordinator's presenting to the students next week, on the process of applying via ACE. Polytechnic also arranging for education on preparing a CV to all the students and other relevant information they will require. This class has students whose ethnicity are from all the Pacific Islands and Asia. Interestingly quite a few of the students have come down from Auckland to do the New Zealand Diploma in Enrolled Nursing.

I presented to the enrolled nurse students on Thursday 20<sup>th</sup> February on what a day looks like on a ward within Dunedin Hospital. I also managed to present on the Enrolled Nurse Section and free NZNO fees for 3 years for BN students and EN Students, except if they were working part-time as HCA's They knew nothing about this, which is of real concern, and informed that they really should be a member of a union if on clinical placements. I plan to email the local Organisers regarding this. Not sure if Otago Polytechnic allows them to speak to all the first year nursing students or not.

As I get lot of inquiries locally regarding a shorter BN programme for Enrolled Nurses to RN, I asked the Otago Polytechnic, and the answer was - NO.

But, a few EN's have been accepted into this year's BN programme, from mental health, private surgical hospital and Dunedin Hospital. The EN's from Mental Health, once graduated, will be employed via the Mental Health new graduate programme, where they complete a post graduate paper and are bonded for ? a year.

## Current Issues in Region:

No real issues presently. All those who applied for ENSIPP in 2024 got EN positions via the programme or found their own EN positions.

Emphasised to the all the students today to apply for the ENSIPP, as this will be the only avenue to get into a public hospital.

All the EN's are waiting to see what they will be allowed to do more under the new EN Scope. Jane Wilson, Chief Nurse, Health New Zealand Te Whatu Ora – Southern is presenting at our study day on the 22<sup>nd of</sup> February, "Facing the Future- together".

We have just over 50 attending our study day, down considerably from previous years in Dunedin. Also 5-6 RN's attending, as they say they learn more by attending our study days, than attending specific topic study days.

## <u>News</u>

We have had quite a few EN positions advertised within Dunedin Hospital, mental health and community etc. One EN got a position as Occupational Health Nurse at OceanaGold Macraes Mine.

Forums are to be held across Southern for RN's and EN's regarding the new EN & RN Scopes of Practice & Standards of Competence. Have heard that Lucy Prinsloo will be leading this. (previous tutor in EN programme at SIT, now CNM at Southland Hospital)
