### Education in Region

This year has been extra special for me. I had the privilege to be on stage with all the nursing tutors and watch my 3 New Grad EN's Graduate. It has been a wonderful journey watching our 3 EN's start as our HCA's, transition to the EAYL Program, support them through their studies when they asked for help and then watch them grow into EN's with their own individual strengths and interests. On Friday 14 March we had 16 Enrolled Nursing students graduating from Northtec this year. Northtec currently have 12 students enrolled for semester 1 2025. These numbers could change before head count though. They have noticed a decrease in numbers since the fees free going away. As of right now (time of writing this report) they haven't had any confirmation from our graduating students that they have found employment. Apart from my 3 EN's that work in my team. I also know of 3 other EN's being employed in Kaitaia. 1 within Outreach Immunisation and 2 within Mental Health.

### Current Issues in Region

It almost seems like I am just repeating myself every year with the current issues in the region. Currently within my workplace we have experienced a wage freeze for almost the last year. The 1<sup>st</sup> time in history. Again money for education only going for the Bachelor's Degree. Again nothing for furthering Enrolled Nursing education. The Te Ao Māramatanga Mental Health and Addictions Credentialing Course that Enrolled Nurses were being encouraged to complete after the government put millions of dollars into it, is now also going as of July this year. Where will this leave already credentialed Enrolled Nurses when they have to re-credential? Where will this leave any new Enrolled Nurses that wanted to do this course?

Then we have Winter. Living on staffing shortages, sickness, over worked and overburdened health care professionals. In March we have already seen positive cases of Covid and Influenza A in the Far North, even before the vaccine was available. This has not excluded our own staff. Again like every year, we do our best, we manage each day as it comes, and we somehow seem to get through.

## News

I want to start by saying what a ride these past 4 years have been. What a privilege and honour it has been to be able to be part of the NZNO EN Section National Committee as the Vice Chairperson and 2<sup>nd</sup> Secretary and EN Section Regional Chairperson. To be part of a voice on the Reference committee for the Enrolled Nurse Scope Review. To see the Enrolled Nurse Scope turn from a conversation to a reality. To be involved in such a major milestone in the Enrolled Nursing history in Aotearoa. I believe the New Scope **Statement will allow** Enrolled Nurses to grow, to become leaders in their own rights and to be able to stay in the nursing workforce for a very long time. We just need to ensure that we continued to be supported, education continue to be provided whenever it is needed around our scope and organisations that matter continue to have our backs.

I want to thank the National committee past and present members for all of your guidance, knowledge, support and friendship. What an amazing group of nurses we have standing out the front, fighting for all of us and our nursing futures. Doing the hard mahi, being our voices, having those hard conversations whenever they are needed. They are not doing this for themselves. They do all of this year in, year out for all of you and all those that are not here today. Their mahi is never ending. There is always a new push, a new drive, another reason to ensure Enrolled Nurses in Aotearoa never disappear. Thank you to you all.

I want to thank my Regional Committee for all of your confidence in me as the Chairperson even though I was the only one who lived 3 hours away. I want to recognise all the years of service our regional committee has given to NZNO as has many other regions. We are an aging committee that are looking to retirement and are hoping that one day in the very near future we have a group of fresh Enrolled Nurses ready to support keeping our region alive with active memberships and commitment. Thank You Te Tai Tokerau.

Thank you NZNO and Paul for your commitment to our Section and your support to coming to our meetings and listening to us. Thank you to Nursing Council for agreeing to completing a Scope Review. We are honestly really appreciative.

So as I step down from the National and Regional Committees today, I want to say, I could not have done the last 4 years without each and every one of you. This journey will never be forgotten. The friendships and amazing peers I have met over the years will remain with me always. To Selena, thank you for stepping up, taking on the next chapter of Enrolled Nursing, I look forward to watching you grow, encourage and forge forward for your love of Enrolled Nursing.

We discussed our individual rolls and responsibilities, learning from each other, we reflected on how enrolled nurses have a variety of rolls and an incredible amount of experience, contributing to the health workforce as preceptors, educators, NZNO delegates and in resource rolls, we also shared experiences of our individual responsibilities in our specialised areas.

This year for the first time we included our AGM into the study day, as we really wanted to have more member involvement, this was well received.

Two of our long-standing committee members Dale Spellman, treasurer and committee member of 18 years and Mahalah Ensor, secretary and committee member for 10 years stepped down from the committee and were acknowledged for their commitment.

One highlight of the AGM was having 3 new members putting up their hands to join the committee and we look forward to connecting with them at our next meeting in April.

Study day participants indicated they would like to incorporate the AGM as an item on our yearly study day programme.

### Te Whatu Ora – Health NZ Waitemata

A new clinical couch has been employed to specifically support enrolled nurses into their new scope of practice. Study days have been booked for Doppler assessments and male catheterisation. IV medication is still in the process of being organised.

### Education in Region:

New Zealand Diploma of Enrolled Nursing continues at both Otago and Southland Polytechnics. The students are studying under the previous scope of practice.

**2025 intake** – Otago 30 students  
- Southland 14 students

30 enrolled nurses at Otago and 14 at Southland will sit states in July 2025. Otago Enrolled nurses have just completed their acute placements, and final placement is in mental health. The Otago 2024/25 enrolled nurse students come from a variety of ethnic backgrounds, this being every pacific island in the Pacific Ocean. A few students have also come down from Auckland to do the EN programme, having siblings that are attending the Otago University. I met with half of this class in February, and it was disappointing to hear that they had not heard of NZNO or of free fees for student nurses, if not working as an HCA.

I was asked to present on what a day looks like, role in surgery ward. But managed to also present on the Enrolled Nurse Section.

I consequently sent an email to the NZNO Organisers for Otago and Southland informing them of this and the two student nurse representatives. The Organisers replied that they would be attending both polytechnics and would be promoting the free fees etc. and joining the EN Section.

### ENSIPP:

9 enrolled nurses are currently on the ENSIPP pathway in Dunedin and 3 in Southland. A few, who did not get ENSIPP positions in Dunedin eventually found their own positions. One gaining a position in Timaru and joining the Canterbury ENIPP. One EN Graduate from 2024, was employed as an HCA in Public Health and once graduated, they converted that position to Enrolled Nurse, so that was good to hear.

### **Southern Region Enrolled Nurse Section Study Day 22<sup>nd</sup> February 2025**

We finally held our study day in February at the Otago Museum. Our study day for October 2024, was postponed due to the Civil Emergency (floods) in Dunedin. Approximately 50 attended a very outstanding day of presentations of the following:

- Facing the future together, Chief Nurse, Health New Zealand
- Southern; multi-ethnic programme, this was a very emotional presentation.
- New Enrolled Nurse Scope & Standards of Competence
- Enrolled Nurse Supported into Practice Programme: Prostate Cancer; The Patients journey for Pancreatic Cancer; All things – Gastro.

Six Enrolled Nurses presented from their areas of practice:

District Nursing, Surgery Pre-admission clinic and day of surgery clinic; Proactive – the Enrolled Nurse is the only nurse employed and goes out doing health wellbeing checks in workplaces in Dunedin. Enrolled Nurse presented on working in a rural hospital, which previously was a trust hospital, but now has come under HNZ Southern. Enrolled Nurse working in a General Practice.

### **Current Issues in Region:**

The biggest issue is getting new Enrolled Nurses within our region to join the Enrolled Nurse Section.

### **News**

Enrolled Nurse positions have re-commenced being advertised at Dunedin Hospital, in Mental Health, Paediatrics, district nursing, Cardiac. Southland, mainly in the community e.g. Aged Care.

There are plans by Health New Zealand – Southern to hold a study day for Enrolled Nurses, but nothing to report at this stage. The Clinical Nurse Specialist IV had indicated that Enrolled Nurses would not be doing anything IV. I had discussed this with the Chief Nurse (CN) last year and at the time was agreeable. CN confirmed at study day that EN's would be able to. I feel that things are going to move very slowly in the Southern Region regarding this.
